Freshman Admission Requirements**

- Have a minimum GPA of 2.5 out of 4.0 for years 10, 11, and 12 in high school.
- No SAT or ACT required.
- Complete one of the 4 acceptable English language exams:
 - Acceptable English Proficiency Exams
 - [TOEFL](#) – Test of English as a Foreign Language with a minimum score of 61 on the Internet-Based Test (ETS Code 0236)
 - [IELTS](#) – International English Language Test System with an overall band score of 6.0
 - [PTE](#) - Pearson's Test of English score of 46
 - [Duolingo](#) - English Test score of 95 (request Duolingo to send official score)
- Living in campus housing is required during the first year for freshmen students.

Required for admission:

1. Apply at <https://www.calstate.edu/apply>. We share the application with all 23 CSU campuses. Filter by campus and select “Cal State Channel Islands”, the select desired program.
2. \$70.00 non-refundable application fee can be paid online when submitting the application.
3. The student can upload their high school transcripts and copy of their English proficiency exam results in the online application. Request official Duolingo score (if applicable).
4. Please allow sufficient time to apply for and be granted a student visa from the U.S. Embassy in your home country. For locations and more information on applying for the F-1 visa, please visit the [U.S. Department of State Bureau of Consular Affairs](#) website where you will find a list of Embassy and Consulate locations. Another resource is the [Study in the States](#) website.

After admission, Required for I-20 Document:

- 15-minute zoom meeting with International Programs Staff to discuss next steps.
- Pay the \$175 non-refundable orientation fee.
- CSUCI Financial Affidavit form (emailed with admission letter)
- Provide a bank statement or an original letter on the financial institution’s letterhead showing available funds of \$40,000 USD. The document should list the available balance, the date and the account holder's name. If the student has a sponsor, a person willing to financially support the student while he or she is studying at CI, the sponsor must submit a financial statement, as well as sign the Affidavit of Financial Support.
- Submit a copy of your passport (picture page)

Cost of Attendance (subject to change)

- 30 units per year will cost \$19,744 per year for tuition and fees (not including summer)
- Housing – **Campus housing is mandatory for first year Students** (Fall 2024 and Spring 2025). Students may choose different villages and a meal plan is included. Most Freshman live in Santa Rosa Village - <https://www.csuci.edu/housing/accommodations-rates/index.htm> Cost is estimated at \$13,370 per year for a double and \$14,450 for a single (not including the months of summer and winter break). Check the Housing website for actual costs in April 2024.
- Mandatory Health Insurance from JCB Insurance Company. The current rate is \$1,877 to cover 12 months.
