Looking for Parking on Campus? View Parking Lot Map

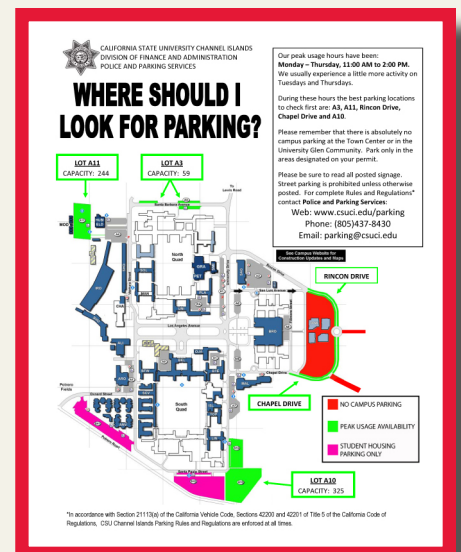
To assist the campus community in finding available parking, Police and Parking Services has identified peak hours of usage and most likely available spaces during regular academic days.

At the end of December 2009, the program had assisted twenty-one CI families and had received donations from thirteen donors. We thank those donors very, very much.

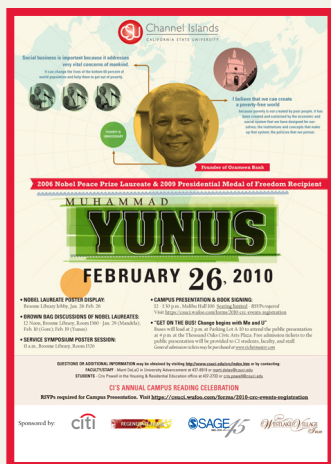
