Look for Purple

Purple signs, irrigation pipes, and sprinkler heads indicate areas of recycled water use. This water is provided by the local water reclamation facility and used for landscape irrigation.

RECYCLED WATER は SAFE FOR:

Safe for irrigating lawns, landscapes and playgrounds

Safe for decorative fountains

Safe for fire protection

Safe for dust control

Many additional non-contact uses



RECYCLED WATER is not SAFE FOR:

Filling pools and spas or any other body-contact uses

Irrigating vegetables and herbs (unless a drip or bubbler system is used)

Do not connect any plumbing to purple pipes
